The story of M _ _ _ _

His mother kept him safe by putting him in a basket in the river. He was found by the Pharaoh's daughter and brought up as a prince but when he got older he didn't like how the Egyptians were treating the Hebrews and ended up having to run away.

As a grown man God came and spoke to him through a bush in the desert which looked as though it was on fire, but wasn't burning up.

M____ became the leader of the Hebrews and showed the people how to follow God – he became one of the most well known leaders of God's people ever, even though he started being rescued from a river.

The story of G _____

He didn't think he was very important but God used him to win an incredible battle against the Midianite army, using torches, jars and trumpets... and God's wisdom!

The story of D _ _ _ _

He was the youngest of 7 brothers who was anointed King because God looks at the heart of people, not their outward appearance. He fought Goliath and helped the Israelite army to win a great battle despite being small – he trusted that God had given him what he needed to win.

You can read more of these 2 parts of his story in 1 Samuel chapter 16 and 17 in the Bible, and lots more about D _ _ _ as King in the book of 2 Samuel. He also wrote lots of the Psalms.

He was a Jew who had been taken in to exile in Babylon. He became a trusted advisor of the king, but continued to worship God. When the law was passed that people must only worship the king he continued to trust and worship God and that meant he got thrown into the lions' den! Arrrrgghh! He continued to ask God for help and God kept him safe from the lions, phew!

The story of P _ _ _ _

He was a fisherman who became one of Jesus' disciples. He often acted first and thought later but Jesus kept reminding him how much he loved him and that he could still be used by God to tell other people the story of Jesus.
