What's been happening this term ...

- I now have a Support Group and it has given me such a boost to know there is group
 of people, standing with me and supporting me in 'thought and word and deed'. I
 am certain it is no coincidence that this last term feels like the most fruitful so far.
- We have moved to 'At a Loss' as our 'umbrella organisation' for the 1-2-1 Listening Service and Nick and Pete (from At a Loss) have compiled the new training programme, for which Nick has produced some fantastic training materials - it's now worth coming on the training just to get the participant booklets!
- These new materials were used for the first time at the South Lakes 1-2-1 Listening Service Training, where 23 participants completed Session 1 and 12 went on to complete Session 2. (comments below)
- As a result of attending the training, Ruth (NISCU Schools' worker) is looking to run the training in her church in N. Cumbria.
- Cathy (NISCU volunteer S. Lakes) and I had a very positive visit to a school in Windermere, discussing the establishment of a Listening Service in the summer term, and we have 2 more schools lined up for initial visits.
- I had a productive meeting with Laura Watson (Deputy Director of Education, Carlisle Diocese) and Ruth Houston (NISCU Trustee) regarding the deployment of the Listening Service within the Diocese and I will be speaking at a Headteachers' networking event on 24th May.
- As a result of the above meeting, our 2 patient, as yet unplaced volunteers from West Cumbria may have found a school.
- Training is taking place in N. Lancs early in the summer term (details below)
- I met with the pastoral lead of a secondary school in N. Lancs who are desperately keen to have the Listening Service reestablished in their school.

Funding is in place for the 1-2-1 Listening Service for 3 years from when I was appointed in September 2021. We are now half way through that period - time flies! The need for the 1-2-1 Listening Service is definitely growing. In order to maintain and develop our provision across all of the NISCU areas, funding must be found for us to go beyond the initial 3 year period. To this end, Amanda, Nick and I have submitted an application to 'Cumbria Community Foundation' and we will be looking to other funding and grant-making organisations. The Cumbria Community Foundation panel will be making decisions on 9th May - please pray for favour on our application. Thank you.
