1000 pupils in 1 day!

Last term, I had the opportunity to speak to over 1,000 pupils in just 1 day as we took round our Christmas assembly. The first 980 of these were in community schools, mostly of children with little or no church background at all. I'm not sure I can adequately explain the feeling of looking out to 300 children previously unfamiliar with the Christmas story, singing joyfully with their whole hearts, *"This is Jesus, Emmanuel our Lord, He is with us, Give praise forevermore!"*

We have just started our run of assemblies exploring Easter, where I will get to ask more than 3,000 children what they make of the empty tomb and investigate how Jesus can be alive today, as my colleagues talk to many more. Where else do we have that opportunity?

But of course, it is not just about numbers. I have had the privilege of being involved in clubs and lessons right through all the school year groups (again, even within one day)! I've seen young people grow in understanding and confidence in asking their own questions. In two separate schools when taking a Christmas lesson, I had children say to me *"I know now why we give presents at Christmas, it's because Jesus himself is the present!"* This is not something we had explicitly taught in the lesson, but the conclusion they had come to by the end.

Why Support?

Recently I met four students who were eager to hear more about Christianity. One in particular had some experience of faith though her family, who are nominally Catholic, but she wanted to know more, including where she could get a Bible. Meeting young people like this is rare, but if we (the church) don't reach out there will be many who miss out on hearing the Good News, or discovering what our faith is all about! **Jonny**

The financial position of NISCU North Lancs is sound – but it is also a limiting factor in our employment of schools' workers. We have started 2024 with reduced staff hours compared to 2023. This is because, whilst regular giving has remained largely stable, costs have gone up considerably over the last 2 years in particular, and we find ourselves in a position where expenditure exceeds income quite substantially.

So, we request that you prayerfully consider giving, or increasing your level of financial support to help us. It is not comfortable for us to make this request, knowing that many of you face the same pressures. Even if you are not in a position to give more at this point, we would be grateful for any help you can give us in communicating these needs to other members of your churches.
