

Christmas is such a special time! Once the curtains are up, scripts attached, puppets to hand we wait expectantly listening to the children filing in. After a quick welcome it is over to the team member who leads out front.

Up we all go dancing, wriggling and jiggling away to our famous wiggle song, hearing the children giggling and laughing away as they escape into a world of fun and enjoyment. Giggles too as the puppets all freeze.

James and Judy then come up with a large silver sparkling Christmas cracker which on opening reveals a paper crown for King Jesus and a fire engine. What are they for? Up shoot hands to explain to rescue people. The twin puppets nod

enthusiastically as Margaret explains Jesus is the real rescuer and Saviour.



The second song sees Mary and Joseph up with the chief angel singing "Joseph you don't need to be afraid" before angels join in the chorus and two Jesus banners keep flying up and down. "And you're going to give him a name that's great. It'll be a name that means that



He will save his people from their sins! Call him Jesus, J E S U S."

In the stable scene we meet some of the animal characters who were caught up in that first Christmas. Joseph's donkey who found it a very busy time with lots of people and animals coming and going, Clara the cow who saw the brave lady placing the baby in her feeding trough; Fluffy who came with the shepherds having seen amazing angels in the sky and rude Camilla the camel who came on a long, strange journey to give gold and special spices to a baby King.

Finally in the song Ding Dong Ding, Angels Sing, up comes a musical band of angels comprising two keyboards, castanets, drums, saxophone, singer and bass guitar set to a fast moving and boppy Christmas Cheer Song.

Children clap and have had a special time meeting baby Jesus who came to earth to start his mission to save everyone of us.




Holly has been leading dance clubs:






ANGELS

What do I need?






- · Thick cardboard
- Dark blue paint
- Metalic pens (or glitter!)
- Pipe cleaners (or thin wire)
- Tape

How do I make them?

- 1. Draw an angel outline onto some thick cardboard and cut out.
- 2. Paint your shape dark blue and leave to ORY!!
- 3. When dry, use metallic pens or glitter to add patterns to your angel.
- 4. With some pipe cleaners make wing shapes and attach to the back of your angel with tape. If you have thin wire you could also add a halo.
