Easter, a season of surprises

Surrounded by beautiful scenery and the team in costume, students were skilfully led on an interactive journey exploring and reflecting on different stages of the Easter story. Over three days many more Primary schools in and around Windermere have journeyed through Experience Easter.

These events are always full of surprises, some students are surprised about other student's questions, and often surprised about the answers to the questions. We also gain insight into what questions are coming to mind for young people in this season, which is so helpful and can inform how we walk with Year 7 in this season,
