West Cumbria - Day 1 (tbc)...again let us know if you are interested!



## Review


2024-2025



It took 3 years for the Listening Service to be active in 5 schools but this last year, the number of schools we are involved with has almost doubled to 9.

Our active volunteers have increased from 13 to 18.

the number of Listening Sessions completed has increased from 1317 to 1561...



...and this last year we have listened to 209 individual pupils (Sept 24- July25). That is 209 lives that have had a little taste of the love of God through being given an opportunity to feel heard and seen during a listening session.



# New for September 25

In September the service will go live when 4 new volunteers start listening in 2 new schools, one in North Lancs. and one in West Cumbria.

Please pray for the new volunteers starting in schools in September






# Impact
